This program is designed for the adult who comes to Eastern with professional preparation and experience in the form of apprenticeship training and is interested in further educational training to support workplace development and promotion.

Note:

- this program enables the adult learner to translate experiential and/or apprenticeship learning into elective credit through the development of a portfolio;
- portfolios are submitted to faculty members who determine the credit award, (up to 60 maximum elective credits for prior learning and apprenticeship experience);
- portfolio assessment does require a fee: please contact the Interdisciplinary Studies Program for current fee information.
