HEALTH PSYCHOLOGY MAJOR, BACHELOR OF SCIENCE (BS)

Proficiency in English (http://catalog.ewu.edu/undergraduate-degree/#newitemtext) and Quantitative and Symbolic Reasoning (http://catalog.ewu.edu/undergraduate-degree/#mathcompproficienciestext) are the prerequisites for many of these courses. Completing PSYC 309 prior to PSYC 310 is highly recommended.

There is no overall GPA requirement for the major.

Grade Requirements

- To declare the BS Health Psychology major, students must have a minimum cumulative GPA ≥2.0 and taken and passed PSYC 100 (or its equivalent) with a grade ≥C.
- · Transfer students may be given credit for appropriate transfer courses in the major and for electives.
- Transfer credits will be limited to 20 lower division courses and no more than 30 transfer credits total applied toward the degree.
- PSYC 100, PSYC 231, PSYC 309, PSYC 310 and PSYC 490C must be passed with a grade ≥C.
