

ART - EDUCATION K-12 MAJOR, BACHELOR OF FINE ARTS (BFA)

Students who complete the coursework and other requirements for this BFA degree will be eligible for Washington State Teacher Certification and are eligible to be employed in the public school system as an art teacher. Teaching art is a highly rewarding career choice with a variety of employment possibilities - not only are art teachers needed in public schools - but they are also employed in museums, community centers, and/or in corporate training venues, etc. Of note, Eastern Washington University's outstanding art education program strives to produce effective teachers who are working artists.

All Art Education students will work closely with an Art Advisor as they complete the program. This program requires all majors to apply to the School of Education (<https://www.ewu.edu/cpp/education/application-process/>) in their Junior year before completing the Secondary Education requirements in their Senior year.

This major satisfies the endorsement for preschool to grade 12.

Secondary Education Program Prerequisites

All prerequisite courses must have been completed within the last 6 years.

A grade \geq B- in all prerequisite courses is required for admission to the Education program.
